Flutist Ruth Ann Ritchie is the founder and Executive Director of Astraios. Since 2007 she has established concert series in Texas and Colorado and led Astraios ensembles in performances across the U.S. She is the founding flutist of both The August Winds quintet and the Cirrus Quartet.


Ruth Ann studied at the Cleveland Institute of Music and the Cleveland Music School Settlement before receiving a Bachelor of Music with Distinction in Flute Performance from Indiana University. She continued her studies at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, receiving a Graduate Diploma in 2006. Her primary teachers have been Tom Robertello, Alexa Still, Linda White, and Joseph Juhos.

Ruth Ann also serves as Executive Director of the Dallas-based Orpheus Chamber Singers. Ruth Ann holds certificates of nonprofit management, development, nonprofit finance, and marketing from the Center for Nonprofit Management, and a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in the Workplace Certificate from the University of South Florida. She is also the founder of Radial Arts Consulting, where she works with organizations across the country on best business practices for performing artists.

Michael Jones serves as Astraios's Programming Director, coordinating ensembles, arranging music for our versatile ensembles, and managing our elementary school programs.

Michael received his Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from Indiana University, where he held an Associate Instructorship. Michael subsequently received a Fulbright Grant to study bassoon performance and pedagogy at the Sydney Conservatorium, where he received a Graduate Diploma in 2006. During this time, he also toured with the Australian Chamber Orchestra. In 2016, he was the Acting Principal Bassoonist of the Texarkana Symphony, and has performed regularly with the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra since 2013.







Daniel Kelly, a native of Charleston, SC, joined Texas A&M University-Commerce in the fall of 2010 after serving on the faculty of Indiana State University and the University of Southern Mississippi.

Dr. Kelly holds a BS in trumpet performance from Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, Tennessee, and a MM and DMA from the University of Illinois at Urbana–Champaign. His principal teachers include Michael Ewald, Ronnie Romm, Ray Sasaki, and Richard Steffen. He has been designated a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music (NCTM) by the Music Teachers National Association and is a member of the Music Teachers National Association, the College Music Society, the International Trumpet Guild, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi. Dr. Kelly is a Yamaha Performing Artist/Clinician.

Eric Jones got his start in music at an early age, studying voice with his father, Robert Jones, and singing in many children's roles, including *Amahl and the Night Visitors*. He began studying the violin and viola at age 10, and received a Bachelor and Master of Music in Viola Performance and a Masters in Musicology from the University of North Texas. He is a PhD candidate in Musicology at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Eric studied Bolivian folk music as a Fulbright Scholar in Cochabamba, Bolivia, and is a specialist in the folk music traditions of Latin America and the Andes. He teaches world music at the University of Texas at Dallas and Southern Methodist University. He is also a regular performer of both solo works and chamber music, and has performed with orchestras in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area.





Libby Vanatta, a native of Middle Tennessee, joined the music faculty at Texas A&M University–Commerce in 2010 as Instructor of Piano. She currently teaches class piano, piano pedagogy, piano literature, and private piano lessons. An active accompanist, Libby has also performed throughout the country at conferences, competitions, and in guest artist recitals. Passionate about chamber music, Libby formed Doppio Movimento in 2011 with her Texas A&M University–Commerce colleague, Dr. Luis Sanchez.

Libby Vanatta holds a Bachelor of Science in piano performance from Austin Peay State University in Clarksville, Tennessee, and a Master of Music in piano pedagogy from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign.
